



02023 Waste Management



All containers must be labeled at all times. If a product is taken from its original “manufacturer’s” container, the secondary “point-of-use” container must also be labeled. The label must include the name of the product in the container, and if the product has an associated hazard such as flammability, corrosivity, reactivity, or toxicity, that also must be shown on the container.

All containers must remain “**CLOSED AT ALL TIMES**” unless you are **ACTIVELY** in the process of adding to or removing from the contents. **Actively**, means that you are “right there”, and actually working to add or remove the contents.

No chemical or waste of any kind should be poured down any sink, toilet, floor drain, or storm drain.

No products of any kind may be brought from home for use at Atlantic without prior approval of your Supervisor. If approved, a MSDS must accompany all products brought onto the facility.

The following items can not be placed in the regular trash cans or dumpsters

1. Any items that have paint or solvent on them this includes rags, paint rollers & brushes, paper suits, gloves, etc. **must be placed in a drum with a Hazardous Waste label**
2. Any rags that have any cleaning solvents or non-petroleum chemicals on them such as WD-40, PB Blaster, contact cleaner, brake fluid, PVC glue and cleaner, 520 adhesive, NDT penetrant dye and developer, etc. **must be placed in a drum with a Hazardous Waste label**
3. Any rags that have any petroleum (oil based) chemicals on them such as lube oil, hydraulic oil, Marvel Mystery oil, etc., can not be placed in a regular trash can or dumpster, but should be placed in the drums that have a green “Non-Hazardous Waste” label.
4. Used aerosol cans should be placed in the drums labeled “USED AEROSOL CAN STORAGE – TO BE SORTED”. Remove the nozzle prior to placing the can into the drum.
5. Mercury Containing Devices” such as florescent light tubes, thermostats, float switches, etc. should be turned over to the Electrical Dept. for management and storage, preferably in the original container.
6. Used Lead-Acid batteries should be turned over to the Maintenance Dept. for management and storage. Used Ni-Cad batteries should be turned over to the Warehouse Toolroom for management and storage. Carbon-Zinc and Alkaline batteries (flashlight type) may be placed in the regular trash cans or dumpsters.

Used Oil

Any container that contains “Used Oil” must be labeled as “USED OIL”, not “Waste Oil” or any other terminology. If the size of the container (not the amount of used oil in the container) is 55 gallons or greater, the container must have secondary containment that has a capacity of at least 110% of the capacity of the “Used Oil container”.
